

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

PASSENGERS MAY NOT HAVE LIQUIDS OR GELS OF ANY SIZE AT THE SCREENING CHECKPOINT OR IN THE CABIN OF THE AIRCRAFT

Including beverages, shampoo, suntan lotion, creams, toothpaste,
hair gel, and other items of similar consistency
Such items may be transported in checked baggage only.

Passengers may have:

- Baby formula, breast milk, or juice if a baby or small child is traveling.
- Prescription medicine with a name that matches the passenger's ticket.
- Insulin and essential other non-prescription medicines.

Beverages purchased in the sterile area must be consumed
before boarding the aircraft.

NOTE: Liquids (alcohol and perfume) purchased in the Duty Free area may be placed in "carry on baggage" and checked at the gate for transport in the hold of the aircraft.
