Team Sangster Academic Grant

MBJ Awards over 180 Students with Grants

Approximately 180 students are set to benefit from academic grants after Monday's staging of the Team Sangster Charity Run/Walk Grants handover ceremony held by MBJ Airports Limited (MBJ), operator of the Sangster International Airport (SIA).

The ceremony, which was hosted on the grounds of SIA, saw students from across western Jamaica proudly clad in uniforms feted to an inspirational evening of activities and entertainment. The recipients ranged from the primary education level to those pursuing tertiary studies in both local and international universities.

Through its many sponsors, MBJ Airports Limited was able to raise \$11 million during the third staging of the annual MBJ Team Sangster Charity Run/Walk, held on September 11.
