MBJ KICKS OFF THE YEAR BY AWARDING J\$4.5M IN GRANTS


The award ceremony hosted by MBJ Airports Limited was held at the Sangster International Airport - New Domestic Terminal. Nadia Anglin-Nolan - Statistics & Air Service Development Analyst at MBJ Airports Limited served as moderator for the function.

4.5 Million Jamaican dollars in academic grants were distributed to 20 students at the Primary, Secondary, and Tertiary level. Recipients included airport employees, their children/dependents as well persons from the surrounding communities. Two (2) community organizations targeting the growth and development of community members with special needs also benefitted from this charitable event.



"Education has always been a top priority for MBJ since its inception. GRANT CATEGORIES

MBJ Inclusivity Grant

The MBJ Inclusivity Grant seeks to support programs/projects being implemented by registered local organizations that target the growth and development of community members who are living with a disability.

Total Disbursement: \$990,000

Team Sangster Academic Grant

The Team Sangster Academic Grant is focused on funding the education of current SIA staff or the children of our Team Sangster community. Therefore, employees or their dependents of all companies operating on the airport were eligible to apply in this category.

Total Disbursement: \$2,545,000

MBJ Community Grant

The MBJ Community Grant supports the education of individuals living within low-income communities currently enrolled at all levels of the education system. The aim of the Community-focused grant is to aid children and young adults who reside in St. James.

Total Disbursement: \$965,000

The Montego Bay Autism Center (MBAC) was established in 2010. The Centre provides educational and family support programs which enable extraordinary people to reach their highest potential. From center to home support, their work has a positive impact on the lives of all of the clients and families who walk through their doors.

In addition, to providing direct service, the MBAC works with professionals to enhance their knowledge and skills so that the clients and families they serve receive the best possible support.

Their programs train parents, professionals from MBAC, and other organizations working alongside persons with Autism Spectrum Disorder, to develop strategies for Positive Behaviour Management, and Purposeful Instruction in Early Childhood Education. They employ modern programs based on best practice, to train staff to put into action these programs successfully, and to help families become outstanding advocates for their children.
